## **CPDE engagement of the GPEDC: Locating our objectives in Nairobi + 1**

### **A. CONCEPT**

As CPDE's 2016-2019 Strategic Plan comes into full swing in its second year, the GPEDC remains an important area of engagement. Coming into a year since the Nairobi High-Level Meeting, the GPEDC has yet to operationalise many of what it has committed. Its launch of the 2017-2018 GPEDC Programme of Work (PoW) aims to address this but in itself merits more attention, especially from civil society, to ensure that commitments do not fade in the background or fall short of what has been agreed.

The 2017-2018 GPEDC PoW is meant to detail the work of the GPEDC for the next two years. Its specific goals are to significantly enhance efforts by all stakeholders to achieve impact at country level; increase high-level political engagement and action across the partnership; as well as attract participation by other stakeholders.

However there are varying disconnects to what was pledged in Nairobi and the GPEDC PoW. The Global Partnership, in Nairobi, pledged to renew their full commitments to conclude this unfinished business with the first step being to develop time-bound action plans in relation to these commitments. This however, including accountability mechanisms for private sector engagement in development, is either underdeveloped from the GPEDC PoW or is missing altogether.

This session aims to locate and, if need-be, position and align our objectives in our engagement with GPEDC with CPDE's strategic objectives. This is to ensure that the momentum from HLM2 is sustained and that those gains in Nairobi do not slip through the cracks.

### **B. OBJECTIVES**

- Paint a picture of how the Development Co-operation world is 1 year from Nairobi
- Provide an update regards to CPDE engagement of the GPEDC
- Provide direction to our plans and objectives in the GPEDC
- Locate and position our messages in the GPEDC PoW

### **C. PROGRAMME FLOW**

The session will begin with a 30min brief by the Policy Co-Chairs regarding the state of play of development co-operation 1 year from Nairobi. This will seek to explain the progress and where we are

now in terms of the commitments and agreements last year. This session also seeks to expound on the purpose of the GPEDC PoW and its importance in our engagement with the global partnership.

The heart of the session will be during the world cafe in which there will be 4 stations outlined below. The GC will split into 4 groups and break into these 4 stations in which a group will spend 15mins per station before proceeding on to the next. Each station will be lead by a facilitator and a note-taker.

After all the groups have contributed to each station, the leads will proceed to debrief the plenary of the summary of their respective stations before the closing remarks by the policy co-chair
